APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

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APPLICANT CRITFRIA:

- Applicants must have collected data on an intersectional qualitative research project
- Doctoral students must have advanced to candidacy within the last three years
- Applicants must be currently enrolled in an academic program at a U.S. accredited institution

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS:

In order for your application to receive full consideration, complete the application form and upload the following documents in PDF format. **Each file name should start with your last name. Example: Smith, Jane CV.pdf.**

- 1. Curriculum Vitae
- 2. Letter of support on official letterhead from your dissertation chair. This letter should confirm that your data will be ready for analysis and interpretation prior to your arrival at IQRMI-ADS (See FAQ page for instructions how to submit this letter separately.)
- 3. Brief biographical statement (150 words or less)
- 4. Description of your intersectional qualitative research project (500 words or less) that address the following
 - The purpose of your research including a description of how your project integrates critical race theory and intersectionality
 - The data available for analysis prior to IQRMI-ADS. Include a description of the sample and the type of qualitative or mixed methods data, including interviews, focus groups, or observation data collected
 - The additional skills you seek at IQRMI-ADS that can help you to complete your doctoral program
